Training funds may be available to help eligible registered/licensed child care providers obtain the training and education they need to provide quality child care to children and families.

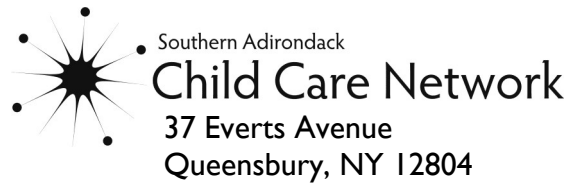

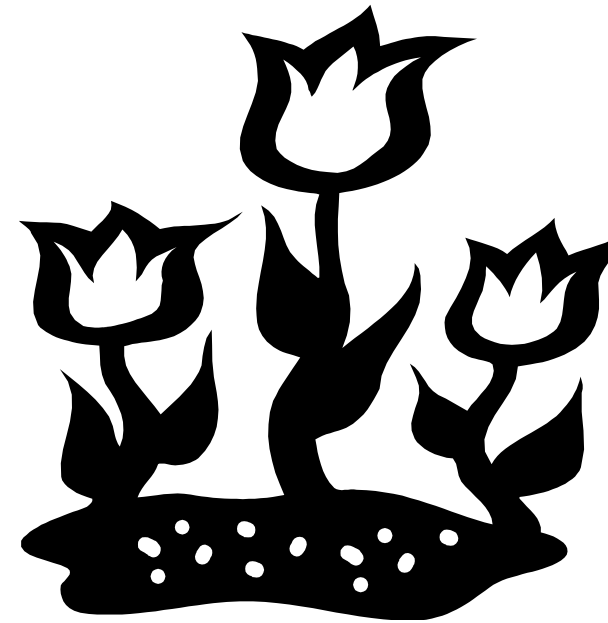
SACCN Training Scholarship

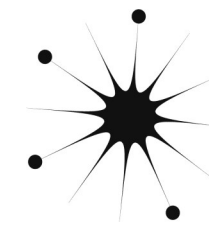

This six-week, 15-hour program has been developed for child care and early education providers in all types of settings: family child care, day care centers, school age care, Head Start, and nursery/preschool programs.

Completion of all six weeks of the "Spring Lecture Series 2019" fulfills 15 hours of training (out of the 30 required by OCFS) and meets all nine Office of Children and Family Services topic requirements for training for child care providers.
